Recommended Paints:

- Titanium White (need larger tube of .150 ml)
 - Cadmium Yellow Light (37ml tube)
 - Cadmium Yellow Medium (37ml tube)
 - Yellow Ochre (37ml tube)
 - Cadmium Red Medium (37ml tube)
 - Alizarin Crimson (37ml tube)
 - Burnt Sienna (37ml tube)
 - Burnt Umber (37ml tube)
 - Raw Umber (37ml tube)
 - French Ultramarine Blue (37ml tube)
 - Phthalo Blue (37ml tube)
 - Sap Green (37ml tube)
 - Viridian Green (37ml tube)

Optional Paints:

- Indian Yellow (highly recommend)
- Quinacridone Rose (highly recommend)
 - Quinacridone Red
 - Cerulean Blue
 - Cobalt Blue
 - Raw Sienna





Brushes are best selected in person so you can see and feel what you like. Purchase brushes based on your painting medium (oil or acrylic).

Recommended Brushes:

Stiff Natural Bristle Paint Brushes:

#6, #2 Round #8, #0 Flat #2 Filbert #1 Bright

Soft Synthetic or Sable Paint Brushes:

#6, #1, #2/0 Round #4, #0 Flat #2 Bright

Optional Brushes:

Small watercolor detail brushes

General Supplies:

Canvas 24" x 18" (or smaller)
PaintBox or tool box
Paper palette
Palette knife (metal)
Cotton rags and/or paper towels

Additional Supplies for Oil Painting:

Odorless turpenoid (1 pint or bigger) Cold press linseed oil (small amount)

2 closable containers for your turpenoid and linseed oil. You can cleaned-out out food jars Brush cleaner soap, Dawn dish, soap, or Murphy's oil soap to clean brushes

Additional Supplies for Acrylic Painting:

Gloss Medium
Retarder
Fluid Medium
Spray Bottle
Soap to clean brushes
Air brush medium added





Optional Supplies:

Pencil Charcoal Sketch Pad Canvas Pad White Chalk
